### **Report of the Event:**



Road traffic injuries are one of the leading causes of deaths, disabilities and hospitalizations with severe socio economic costs across the world. The costs of accidents include medical costs, collateral damage to property and motor vehicle. Losses due to accidents are income foregone being absent from work, impairment/disability or untimely death besides other legal and administrative costs.

Road safety acts as a function of education. As a part of creating awareness and education among the citizens, the transport department is regularly conducting road safety awareness campaigns in all educational institutes. Further awareness is being created through special camps and campaigns undertaken by the district administration. Road safety awareness is also made mandatory for all persons undertaking a learner licence test. 
